Any patient completely dependent for personal care; who is wheel chair bound; suffers from cognitive impairment that limits their awareness of their surroundings or ability to appreciate time; is in the late course of a terminal illness; is showing signs of cachexia and general weakness; or is over 80 years of age unless obviously physically and mentally robust – up triage to a minimum CTAS 3
