

Adhering to a Do-Not-Use List of Abbreviations, Symbols, and Dose Designations

This is a Required Organizational Practice (ROP) for Accreditation

MISINTERPRETED ABBREVIATIONS INCLUDING DRUG NAME ABBREVIATIONS, SYMBOLS, AND DOSE DESIGNATIONS CAN CAUSE MEDICATION SAFETY INCIDENTS SUCH AS INCORRECT MEDICATIONS, INCORRECT DOSES, OR INCORRECT DIRECTIONS FOR USE THAT MAY RESULT IN CLIENT HARM

The do not use abbreviations, symbols and dose designations can be found on the StaffNet:

Clinical team's role:

- REPORT MISINTERPRETED ABBREVIATIONS, SYMBOLS AND DOSE DESIGNATIONS THAT COULD HAVE HARMED, OR DID HARM A CLIENT AS A MEDICATION SAFETY INCIDENT
- ALL SITES SHOULD BE USING THE NEW <u>Prescriber Order Sheet</u> (CLI.4510.PR.002.FORM.13)
