

## **Candidiasis Clinical Practice Tool**

	History	Observation
Maternal Assessment	<ul> <li>Client has been on antibiotics</li> <li>Nipple pain during or between breastfeeding</li> <li>Sharp, shooting pains and/or burning at her nipples/breasts</li> <li>Cracks on her nipples/areola that do not heal</li> <li>Itchy or burning nipples/areolas</li> <li>History of mastitis</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Nipples are red, sore, cracked and shiny</li> <li>Areolas are red, swollen, flaky, scaly or shiny</li> </ul>
Infant Assessment	<ul> <li>Baby has been on antibiotics</li> <li>A change in his/her breastfeeding behavior</li> <li>Baby is fussy at the breast, or has been pulling on and off at the breast</li> <li>A change in temperament</li> <li>Baby is gassy or cranky</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>No signs</li> <li>White patches on tongue, gums, mucosa (mother of pearl sheen)</li> <li>Red scalded looking diaper area which does not respond to zinc oxide treatment</li> </ul>
Family Assessment	<ul> <li>Family members with a history of thrush or yeast infections (e.g. jock itch)</li> <li>Family member with white patches in mouth or red cracks in corner of mouth</li> </ul>
