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STANDARD GUIDELINE SUBJECT:

Equivalency of Nursing Students to work as a Health Care Aide Guideline

PURPOSE:

To ensure a nursing student enrolled in a Manitoba nursing education program has the equivalencies to work as a Health Care Aide.

DEFINITIONS:

Health Care Aide: provides direct client care and environmental support within the established standards of care, policies and procedures. The Health Care Aide meets the special and changing needs of clients and assists them in reaching and maintaining optimum health and independence under the direction of the regulated health care professional.

Nursing Student: A student enrolled in a nursing education program that is approved by the regulatory body governing the nurse category (RN, RPN, LPN).

PROCEDURE:

EQUIVALENCY OF PRACTICAL NURSING - Assiniboine Community College

A nursing student who has successfully completed the following courses should be able to work as a Health Care Aide in an institutional setting with some orientation:

- Psychology (PSSY-0026)
- Canadian Nursing Principles (HLTH-0183)
- Human Growth and Development (HLTH-0007)
- Interpersonal Communication (COMM-003)

- Gerontological Nursing (HLTH-0012)
- Nutrition (HLTH-0236)
- Nursing Arts and Assessment 1 (HLTH-0010)
- Health Restoration & Reorganization 1 (HLTH-0133)
- Practicum 1 PRAC-0218
- Practicum 2 PRAC-0219

Note: These courses are often completed by the end of Term 3 of a 5 Term Practical Nurse Diploma Program. It will be the students' responsibility to provide perspective employers with mark statements or transcripts showing what courses they have successfully completed in their respective programs.

Diploma Practical Nursing students - Universite de Saint-Boniface

A nursing student who has successfully completed the following courses should be able to work as a Health Care Aide in an institutional setting with some orientation:

- BIOL 1415 Anatomy of the Human Body and BIOL 1417 Physiology of the Human Body
- SANT 1035 Human Growth and Development
- SINF 1018 Introduction to Nursing
- SINF 1026 Professional Communication in Healthcare
- DSI 106 Chronic Care
- SINF 1046 Health Assessment (head to toe, healthy adult; lab and theory)
- DSI 104 Practicum: Introduction to nursing practice (clinical sites)
- DSI 108 Practicum: Adult Care (clinical sites)
- DSI 101 Nursing Skills I (basic care; theory and lab)
- DSI 107 Nursing Skills II (medication administration, basic wound care; theory and lab)

Note: These courses are completed by the end of first year of the Practical Nurse Diploma Program. It will be the students' responsibility to provide perspective employers with mark statements or transcripts showing what courses they have successfully completed in their respective programs.

EQUIVALENCY OF BACHELOR OF NURSING

To be equivalent to an approved "Health Care Aide Certificate from a recognized program", the student must successfully be enrolled in Year 2 of the Bachelor of Nursing Program and completed the following:

Non-Academic Admission Requirements:

- Completed immunizations, Influenza Vaccine.
- CPR at the Health Care Provider Level (C) (renewed annually).
- Criminal Record Search Certificate, including Vulnerable Sector Search, Adult and Child Abuse Registry Check.

• Clinical practice related orientation to and/or completion of required learning experiences/certifications/procedures related to: Pyxis, PHIA, Safe Patient Moving & Handling, Mask Fit Testing, WHMIS, & Violence prevention program.

A transcript must accompany the application and is reviewed to verify the requirements are met. It is the students' responsibility to provide perspective employers with mark statements or transcripts showing what courses they have successfully completed in their respective programs.

Four-Year Bachelor of Nursing Program, College of Nursing - Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Manitoba, Fort Garry Campus

A nursing student in this program who has successfully completed the following:

- Violence Prevention Program

It will be the students' responsibility to provide perspective employers with mark statements or transcripts showing what courses they have successfully completed in their respective programs.

BN Program students - Universite de Saint-Boniface

A student from the Universite de Saint-Boniface, BN Program who has successfully completed the following courses should be able to work as a Health Care Aide in an institutional setting, with some orientation:

It will be the students' responsibility to provide perspective employers with mark statements or transcripts showing what courses they have successfully completed in their respective programs.

Joint BN Students – University College of the North

In order for students in the JBN program of UCN to obtain a letter confirming they have the training to work as a HCA.

The following courses are year one courses that would have to be completed prior to a student moving on to year 2 of the program:

- UC.NUR.128U Introduction to Nursing
- UC.NUR.126U Human Growth & Development.

The student must have successfully completed the following courses in year 2:

- UC.NUR.213U.L Nursing Skills Lab/Clinical
- UC.NUR.2230 Health Promotion of Older Adults and Their Families (UC.NUR.215U Facilitation of Self-Care (this was the old course code/name for UC.NUR.2230)

Students also need to be certified in CPR at the Healthcare provider level.

It will be the students' responsibility to provide perspective employers with mark statements or transcripts showing what courses they have successfully completed in their respective programs.

EQUIVALENCY OF BACHELOR OF SCIENCE in PSYCHIATRIC NURSE TRAINING

To be equivalent to an approved "Health Care Aide Certificate from a recognized program", the student must successfully be enrolled in Year 2 of the Bachelor of Science in Psychiatric Nursing Program. A transcript must accompany an application and is reviewed to verify the requirements are met.

Bachelor of Science in Psychiatric Nursing Students – Brandon University

A student from the BScPN program who has successfully completed the following courses should be able to work as a Health Care Aide in an institutional setting with some orientation:

- 69:151 Health Promotion: Developmental Transitions throughout the Lifespan
- 69:152 Fundamentals of Psychiatric Nursing Practice 1
- 69:153 Fundamentals of Psychiatric Nursing Practice 2
- 69:161 Introduction to Interpersonal Communication
- 69:255 Integrated Practice 1

It will be the students' responsibility to provide perspective employers with mark statements or transcripts showing what courses they have successfully completed in their respective programs.

EQUIVALENCY OF INTERNATIONAL EDUCATED NURSES (IENs) Applicants who provide an international nursing certificate/diploma/degree/transcript will be considered an uncertified Health Care Aide.

Applicants are encouraged to contact a recognized educational institution in Manitoba to review educational opportunities available to obtain a Health Care Aide certificate. All costs incurred to obtain a recognized Health Care Aide certificate are the responsibility of the applicant. Examples of programs that offer learning assessments are the Manitoba Start Program or Red River College.
