Southern Health-Santé Sud strives to develop an Indigenous Representative Workforce Strategy where Indigenous employees within the organization are represented at all occupational levels (entry, professional management, etc) based on the population that it serves. Southern Health-Santé Sud's Indigenous Representative Workforce Strategy, in partnership with communities, organizations and government agencies, addresses the issue of a representative Indigenous workforce in the southern region through various long and short-term recruitment and retention strategies.
