

Infection Rates

This is a Required Organization Practice (ROP) for Accreditation

HEALTHCARE ASSOCIATED INFECTIONS (HAI) ARE INFECTIONS ACQUIRED BY PATIENTS WITHIN A HEALTH CARE SETTING

- About one out of every 10 patients admitted to hospital will acquire a HAI
- Patients with HAIs remain in hospital longer on average than those without a HAI
- HAIs and outbreaks result in a significant cost to the health care organization
- It is estimated that up to 70% of HAIs are preventable
- Surveillance is a critical component of HAI infection prevention and control programs

Your role in preventing the spread of infections in your program/facility/area of care

- OFFER STAFF AND PATIENTS EDUCATION ON PROPER INFECTION PREVENTION TECHNIQUES, SUCH AS HAND HYGIENE & COUGH ETIQUETTE
- ADHERE TO INFECTION CONTROL PROTOCOLS (I.E. ROUTINE PRACTICES, POINT-OF-CARE RISK ASSESSMENT, ADDITIONAL PRECAUTIONS AS INDICATED, PROPER USE OF PPE)
- DIRECT CARE STAFF TO COMPLETE THE HAI SURVEILLANCE REPORT FORM FOR ALL SUSPECTED AND CONFIRMED HAIS AND SUBMIT TO THE SITE INFECTION CONTROL PRACTITIONER (ICP)

- METHICILLIN RESISTANT STAPHYLOCOCCUS AUREUS (MRSA)
- CLOSTRIDIOIDES DIFFICILE INFECTION (CDI)

How are HAI results made available for staff?

- SITE SPECIFIC QUARTERLY HAI REPORTS ARE SHARED WITH EACH SITE
- SURGICAL SITE INFECTION (SSI) REPORTS ARE SHARED QUARTERLY WITH SURGICAL SITES
- ANNUAL IP&C REPORTS ARE PREPARED AND DISTRIBUTED TO REGIONAL LEADERSHIP AND POSTED PUBLICLY
 ON THE SH-SS WEBSITE
