REPORTING REQUIREMENT: Manitoba’s Public Health Act purpose is to enable the delivery of public health services to protect and promote the health and well-being of the people of Manitoba.	RESPONSIBILITY
<p>The Reportable Diseases and Conditions by Health Professionals and Labs of the Manitoba Public Health Act, indicates that all healthcare professionals have a duty to report. SH-SS policy “Reporting of Infectious Diseases and Conditions by Health Care Professionals in Acute and Personal Care Homes”. <input type="checkbox"/> A healthcare professional that suspects or confirms a reportable disease and/or condition of a patient/ resident that is listed in Schedule B of the Reportable Diseases and Conditions by Health Professionals and Labs , has a duty to report.	⊙
<input type="checkbox"/> All reportable diseases and conditions have specific protocols to follow as per (Communicable Disease Management Protocols Health Province of Manitoba (gov.mb.ca))	⊙
IMMEDIATE REPORTING of COMMUNICABLE DISEASES	
<input type="checkbox"/> Complete the Clinical Notification of Reportable Diseases and Conditions form for any suspected clinical cases of the following diseases: Botulism; Cholera; Diphtheria; Measles; Meningococcal Invasive Disease; Mumps; Pertussis; Plague; Poliomyelitis; Rabies; Rubella; Severe Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI); Smallpox; Viral Hemorrhagic Fever. <p>NOTE: <u>Immediate verbal</u> notification to the Surveillance Unit/Medical Officer of Health (MOH) is required. Phone numbers are located on the form.</p>	⊙
<input type="checkbox"/> Notify the Site Infection Control Practitioner &/or the Regional Coordinator(s), Infection Prevention & Control and implement appropriate infection prevention and control precautions as applicable to the suspected or confirmed case to prevent spread.	⊙
REPORTING WITHIN 5 BUSINESS DAYS of other COMMUNICABLE DISEASES	
<input type="checkbox"/> Complete the Clinical Notification of Reportable Diseases and Conditions form for any suspected clinical cases of diseases. The following diseases are reportable within 5 business days via fax: AIDS; Congenital Rubella Infection/Syndrome; Creutzfeldt-Jakob Disease; Leprosy; Tetanus; Tuberculosis; Yellow Fever.	⊙
<input type="checkbox"/> Complete the “Tick-Borne Disease Clinical Report Form” and fax within 5 business days for the following: Anaplasmosis; Babesiosis and Lyme Infections.	⊙

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FURTHER REPORTING	
<p><input type="checkbox"/> Complete the Clinical Notification of Reportable Diseases and Conditions form for a reportable disease suspected also under the following circumstances:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ At death, if it is reasonably believed that the patient/client/resident may have had a reportable disease or the reportable disease contributed to the death. ➤ At biopsy or autopsy, if, in performing the biopsy or autopsy, finds evidence of a reportable disease. <i>*Benign tumor of the brain or central nervous system & *Cancer or Malignant Neoplasms are captured by pathology/cytology testing and reported through laboratory/diagnostics processes to Cancer Care Manitoba. (CCMB)</i> ➤ Upon becoming aware that a person has a disease or condition that is not otherwise reportable, if the disease or condition is occurring in a cluster or outbreak, or has presented itself with unusual clinical manifestation. <p>If reporting an outbreak, refer to the “Outbreak Management – Respiratory (including Influenza and COVID-19) and Gastrointestinal” regional policy CLI.8011.PL.004.</p>	◎
