## **PURPOSE:**

- To provide guidance, information and a standardized process for health care professionals in emergency departments (ED), urgent care (UC), special units (SCU) and inpatient units to identify and manage patients with Intermediate Risk (submassive) or High Risk (massive) Pulmonary Embolism (PE) and consulting of Pulmonary Embolism Response Team (PERT).
- To provide a rapid response to manage confirmed or highly suspected acute PE in adult patients by utilizing the PERT pathway.
