

Scabies Line Lists for Treatment Categories

Category I: Norwegian or crusted scabies are defined as "heavy" infestation (>50 lesions) or long term involvement that has been refractory to previous treatment.

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Category II: Typical or probable scabies are defined as <50 skin lesions, no crusting or scaling, and papular rash or burrows involving a small or moderate area of skin surface.

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Category III: Possible scabies is defined as atypical skin lesions or no skin lesions but direct contact with persons classified in Category I or II, their bedding, or their cloths (e.g. Health Care Workers, Volunteers, Therapists, and Household Members).
