

HOME CARE ATTENDANT ASSIGNMENT TASK PLAN – Non-Narcotic Transdermal Patch

PROBLEMS TO WATCH FOR AND REPORT

- Client complains of pain or itching around patch.
- Redness or irritation from patch that does not resolve shortly after removal.
- Skin tears with removal of patch.

	Procedure – Application and Removal of Prescribed Non-Narcotic Transdermal Patch
	Wash hands.
	Apply disposable gloves.
3.	Review Five Rights of Medication Assistance:
	Right Person
	Right Drug
	Right Dose
	Right Time
	Right Route
4.	Identify area for application. Ensure it is free of hair, there are no cuts, burns, scrapes or ope
	skin.
5.	Wash area and dry well.
6.	Prepare label with initials, date and time.
7.	Remove patch from wrapper, throw wrapper in bio-hazard container.
8.	Apply label to the patch, do not cover dose indicated on the patch.
9.	Bend plastic backing of the patch along seam and peel off one side of plastic backing placing
	garbage in bio-hazard container.
10	Apply sticky exposed side of patch smoothly to client's skin and hold gently. Peel remaining
	side of plastic backing off patch, at the same time slide your other hand across to press entir
	patch gently onto the client's skin.
11	Firmly press entire patch against the client's skin to make sure it sticks well.
12	Ensure all garbage from patch is disposed of into bio-hazard container.
13	Remove disposable gloves and discard.
14	Wash hands.
15	Clean up supplies.
16	Document correctly on the Home Care Medication Assignment Record – Home Care
	Attendant.
17	Removing the patch: Wash hands.
18	Apply disposable gloves.
19	Locate correct patch (should be marked on Home Care Medication Assignment Record –
	Home Care Attendant).
20	Remove patch by holding skin tight with one hand, use other hand to carefully peel patch
	from skin.

21. Fold patch in half so that sticky sides are stuck together.
22. Discard old patch into bio-hazard container.
23. Wash client's skin where patch was with warm, lightly soaped washcloth, pat dry.
24. Remove disposable gloves and discard.
25. Wash hands.
26. Document correctly on the Home Care Medication Assignment Record – Home Care
Attendant.
