5 ***** Emergent	<ul> <li>Client situations requiring immediate intervention due to imminent danger of life threatening circumstances</li> <li>Suicide attempt/serious self-harm in progress. Acute Suicidal ideation with clear plan and means and/or history of same with no ability to assess (ie: hung up, client left).</li> <li>Violence/threats of violence and/or possession of weapon</li> <li>Acute mental health disturbance that requires RCMP/Ambulance/intervention in Emergency</li> </ul>	• Call 911	• Call 911
4 **** Urgent	<ul> <li>Acute suicidal ideation or risk of harm to others with clear plan and means and/or history of self-harm or aggression</li> <li>Very high risk behaviour associated with perceptual/thought disturbance, delirium, dementia, or impaired impulse control.</li> <li>Urgent assessment under the Mental Health Act</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Call Crisis Services</li> <li>Call 911 if required</li> <li>Refer to Emergency Department if required</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Call Crisis Services</li> <li>Call 911 if required</li> <li>Refer to Emergency Department if required</li> </ul>
3 *** High	<ul> <li>High risk to harm identified with potential for history of harm AND high functional limitations and lack of community/social supports, and/or;</li> <li>Rapidly increasing symptoms of psychosis and/or severe mood disorder, and/or;</li> <li>High risk behaviour associated with perceptual/thought disturbance, delirium, dementia, or impaired impulse control, and/or;</li> <li>Discharge from acute hospital requiring time sensitive follow-up by CMHP (note that previous history may impact acuity rating)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Call Mobile Crisis Team if required</li> <li>Place on Registry as a 3star and assigned to a CMHW within 48hrs</li> <li>Notify Admin/Manager of client requiring high priority</li> <li>Provide contact information for resources and Crisis lines</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Psychosocial assessment is prioritized with recommendations for the assessed condition;</li> <li>Expedited access to psychiatric consultation as required;</li> </ul>

2 ** Moderate	<ul> <li>Moderate to high risk of harm to self or others with no immediate plan of harm, and/or;</li> <li>Significant client/family distress associated with serious mental illness (including mood/anxiety disorder/early symptoms of psychosis), and/or:</li> <li>Moderate to high functional limitations and low community/ social supports, and/or;</li> <li>Moderate to high risk for decompensation/deterioration</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Provide contact information for resources and Crisis lines</li> <li>Place on Registry Waitlist and offered classes/groups</li> </ul>	• Interventions offered as appropriate		
1 * Basic	<ul> <li>Low to moderate risk identified at initial contact</li> <li>Symptoms of functionally impairing mental health issues e.g. depression, anxiety.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Provide contact information for resources and Crisis lines</li> <li>Place on Registry Waitlist and offered classes/groups</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Interventions offered as appropriate</li> </ul>
